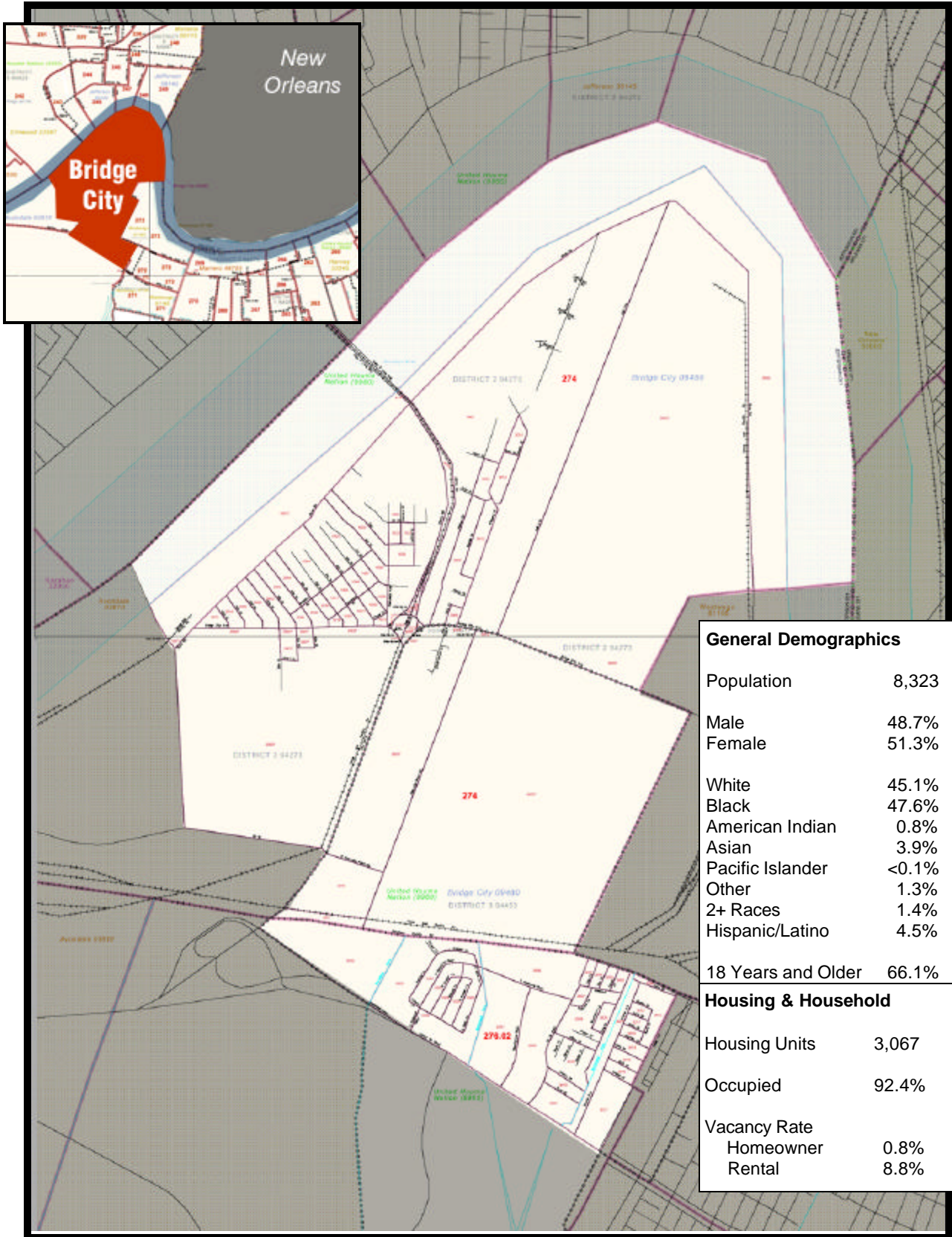


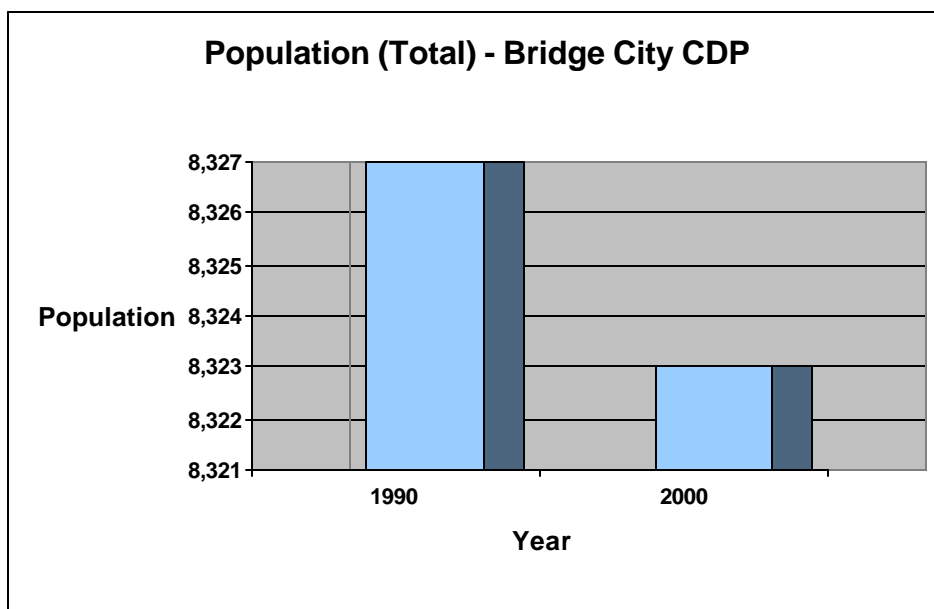
# Bridge City (CDP): Census 2000 Demographics



## Bridge City (CDP): Total Population

### Total Population

The data contained in the 2000 Census reports the total population of Bridge City (CDP) to be 8,323. This is a decrease of 4 persons or 0.1% from the 1990 Census (total population of 8,327 persons). Bridge City (CDP) was added for the 1990 Census. Therefore, no data is available in the 1980 Census.



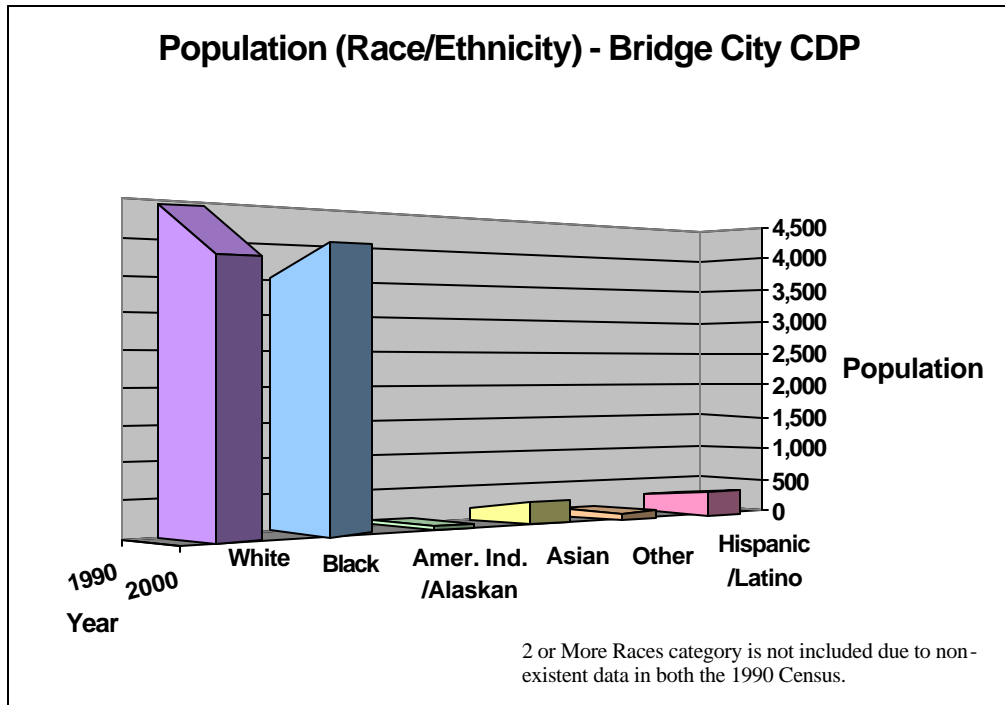
*The 2000 Census indicates a total population for Bridge City (CDP) at 8,323 persons. This is a 0.1% decrease (4 persons) since 1990.*

# Bridge City (CDP): Racial/Ethnic Demographics



The 2000 Census reports the racial composition of Bridge City (CDP) to be 3,752 persons or 45.1% White; 3,958 persons or 47.6% Black/African American; 63 persons or 0.8% American Indian/Alaskan Native; 330 persons or 4.0% Asian/Pacific Islander; and 106 persons or 1.3% of Some Other Race.

The population comprised of Hispanic/Latino ethnicity is reported to be 371 persons or 4.5% of the total population.

## Racial and Ethnic Demographics

The data contained in the 2000 Census reports the racial composition of Bridge City (CDP) to be 3,752 persons or 45.1% White; 3,958 persons or 47.6% Black/African American; 63 persons or 0.8% American Indian/Alaskan Native; 330 persons or 4.0% Asian/Pacific Islander; and 106 persons or 1.3% of Some Other Race. The population comprised of Hispanic/Latino ethnicity is reported to be 371 persons or 4.5% of the total population. Additionally, the 2000 Census introduces a new category for multiracial identity. The population reporting Two or More Races includes 114 persons or 1.4% of the total population.

The White population (3,752 persons or 45.1% of the 2000 Census total population) shows a decrease of 731 persons or 16.3% from the 1990 Census (White population of 4,483 persons or 53.8% of the total population in 1990). There is no data available from the 1980 Census.

The Black/African American population (3,958 persons or 47.6% of the 2000 Census total population) shows an increase of 421 persons or 11.9% from the 1990 Census (Black/African American population of 3,537 persons or 42.5% of the total population in 1990). There is no data available

from the 1980 Census.

The American Indian/Alaskan Native population (63 persons or 0.8% of the 2000 Census total population) shows a decrease of 2 persons or 3.1% from the 1990 Census (American Indian/Alaskan Native population of 65 persons or 0.8% of the total population in 1990).

The Asian/Pacific Islander population (330 persons or 4.0% of the 2000 Census total population) shows an increase of 181 persons or 121.5% from the 1990 Census (Asian/Pacific Islander population of 149 person or 1.8% of the total population in 1990).

The population that is categorized as Some Other Race (106 persons or 1.3% of the 2000 Census total population) shows an increase of 13 persons or 14.0% from the 1990 Census (Some Other Race population of 93 persons or 1.1% of the total population in 1990).

The 2000 Census reports that the population of Hispanic/Latino ethnicity is 371 persons or 4.5% of the total population. This is an increase of 94 persons or 33.9% from the 1990 Census (Hispanic/Latino population of 277 persons or 3.3% of the total population in 1990).

# Bridge City (CDP): Age & Sex Demographics

## Age Demographics

The 2000 Census reports the Age breakdown for Bridge City (CDP) at 2,826 persons or 34.0% of the total population are under eighteen years of age, 4,831 persons or 58.0% of the total population are eighteen to sixty-four years of age, and 666 persons or 8.0% of the total population are sixty-five years and older.

The 1990 Census reported the Age breakdown for Bridge City (CDP) at 3,004 persons or 36.1% of the total population were under eighteen years of age, 4,772 persons or 57.3% of the total population were from eighteen to sixty-four years of age, and 551 persons or 6.6% of the total population were sixty-five years and older.

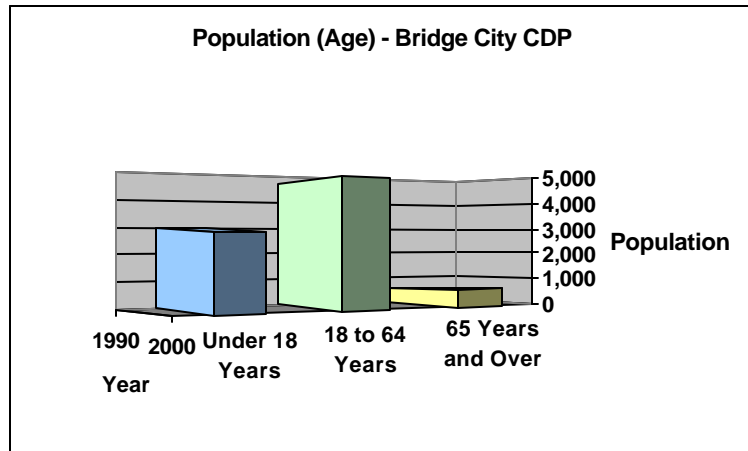
This shows a decrease from 1990 to 2000 for the population under eighteen years of age at 178 persons or 5.9%, an increase for the population eighteen to sixty-four years of age at 59 persons or 1.2%, and an increase in the population sixty-five years and older at 115 persons or 20.9%.

## Sex Demographics

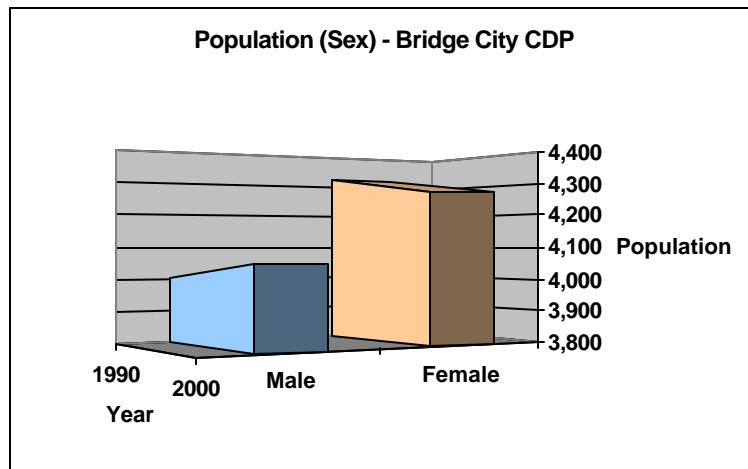
The 2000 Census reports the Sex breakdown for Bridge City (CDP) as 4,056 persons or 48.7% of the total population are Male and 4,267 persons or 51.3% of the total population are Female.

The 1990 Census reported the Sex breakdown for Bridge City (CDP) as 4,002 persons or 48.1% of the total population were Male and 4,325 persons or 51.9% of the total population were Female.

This shows an increase in the population from 1990 to 2000 for the Male population of 54 persons or 1.4% and a decrease for the Female population of 58 persons or 1.3%.



*The 2000 Census calculates the population under eighteen years of age at 34.0% (2,826 persons), the population from eighteen to sixty-four years of age at 58.0% (4,831 persons), and the population sixty-five years and older at 8.0% (666 persons). This shows a 5.9% decrease in the population under eighteen years of age, a 1.2% increase in the population eighteen to sixty-four years of age, and an increase of 20.9% in the population aged sixty-five years and older.*

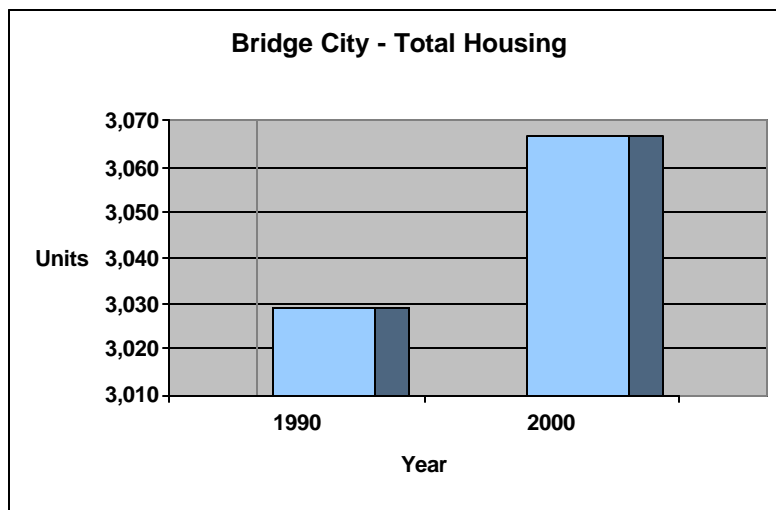


*The 2000 Census indicates the population to be 48.7% male (4,056 persons) and 51.3% female (4,267 persons). This shows an increase of 1.4% for the male population and a decrease of 1.3% in the female population.*

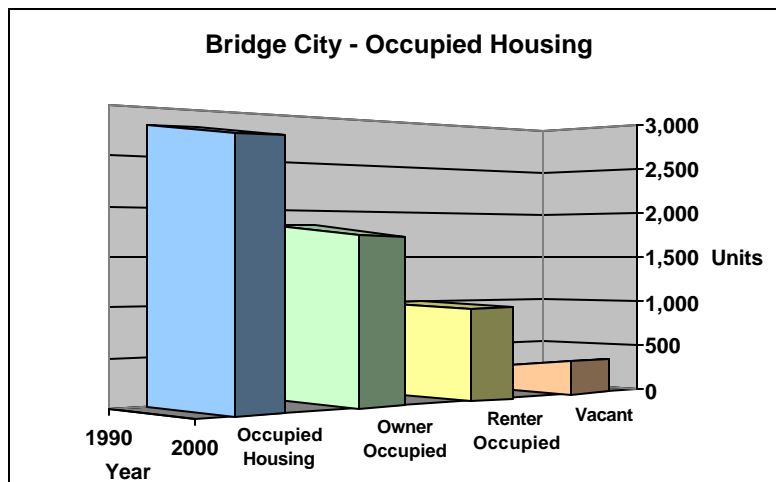

The 2000 Census indicates 3,067 total housing units. This is a 1.3% gain since 1990.



The 2000 Census shows an occupancy rate of 92.4% or 2,834 occupied housing units. This is a 5.9% gain in occupied housing since the 1990 Census.

## Total Housing

The 2000 Census indicates that Bridge City (CDP) has 3,067 total housing units. This is a 38 housing unit increase or a 1.3% gain since the 1990 Census (3,029 total housing units). No data is available from the 1980 Census.

## Housing Occupancy

The 2000 Census indicates that Bridge City (CDP) has 2,834 occupied housing units or 92.4% of total housing. This is a 159 occupied unit increase or a 5.9% gain since the 1990 Census (2,675 occupied housing units or 82.7% of total housing in 1990).

Owner occupied housing consists of 1,834 occupied units or 64.7% of total occupied housing. This is an increase of 123 units or 7.2% in owner occupied housing since the 1990 Census (1,711 owner occupied housing units or 64.0% of the total occupied housing in 1990).

Renter occupied housing consists of 1,000 occupied units or 35.3% of total occupied housing. This is an increase of 36 units or 3.7% in renter occupied housing since the 1990 Census (964 renter occupied housing units or 36.0% of the total occupied housing in 1990).

## Bridge City (CDP): Housing Characteristics

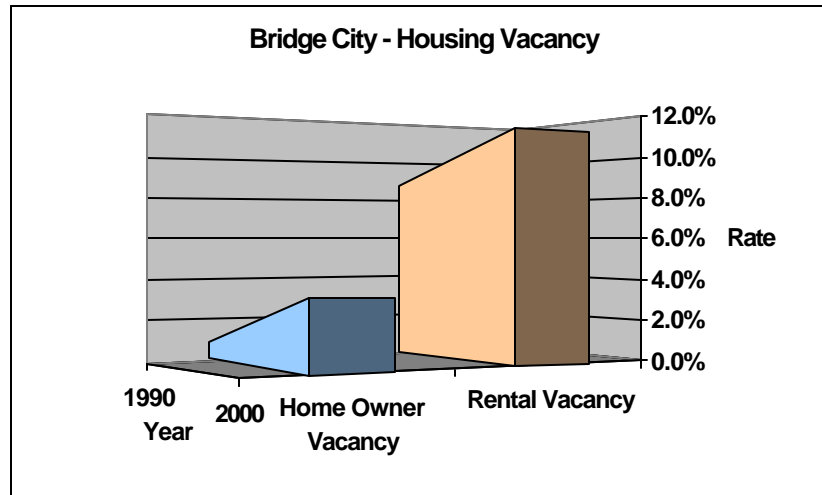
### Vacant Housing

Vacant housing consists of 233 unoccupied units or 7.6% of total housing, which includes 4 units that are classified as seasonal/recreational/occasional use. This is a decrease of 121 units or 34.2% in vacant housing since the 1990 Census (354 vacant housing units or 11.7% of the total housing in 1990).

### Vacancy Rate

The Homeowner Vacancy Rate is 0.8% as of the 2000 Census. This is a rate decrease of 2.6% or a 76.5 percent change since the 1990 Census (3.4% Homeowner Vacancy Rate in 1990).

The Rental Vacancy Rate is 8.8% as of the 2000 Census. This is a rate decrease of 2.4% or a 21.4 percent change since the 1990 Census (11.2% Rental Vacancy Rate in 1990).



*The 2000 Census indicates that the Homeowner Vacancy Rate is 0.8% and the Rental Vacancy Rate is 8.8%.*

## POPULATION HIGHLIGHTS

Bridge City (CDP) has experienced a relatively stable total population since the 1990 Census (-0.1% since 1990). The primary factors for this stability is a reduction in the White population (-16.3% since 1990) that is offset by an increasing Black/African American population (11.9% since 1990). Additionally, the Asian/Pacific Islander population has increased 121.5%.

The population has seen a significant increase in the senior population defined as sixty-five years and older. The 2000 Census shows a 20.9% increase in the sixty-five years and older demographic since 1990.
